

Suggested Trainings to Meet HFA Wraparound Training Standards

An Interim Plan for New HFA Staff

Healthy Families America is committed to providing access to training at no cost to HFA affiliates that meets the HFA Best Practice Standards related to wraparound training. For more than a decade, virtual training has been available through HFA's The Learning Center. As these trainings are no longer available, HFA has identified a set of training resources, some created by HFA, others developed by other organizations, that meet the wraparound training standards. Completing all of the following training activities satisfies the wraparound training requirements as described in the HFA Best Practice Standards.

Like the TLC trainings, this set of trainings is not the only way to meet these standards. Many sites have identified training resources within their community or system that meet the standards related to wraparound training. HFA encourages sites to choose trainings that best meet the needs of their staff and site.

As with all training, sites will need to track the completion of these trainings. HFA has developed an <u>interim wraparound training transcript</u> that sites may choose to use for staff who will be completing this set of trainings. Training certificates are not required in the tracking of the completion of the trainings in this interim plan, but staff and supervisors should document the date that each training was completed. In addition, we encourage site staff to create learner accounts with the Institute for the Advancement of Family Support Professionals, which will give staff and supervisors access to transcripts for these and any other trainings completed on that site.
