

2021 T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® OHIO Annual Report

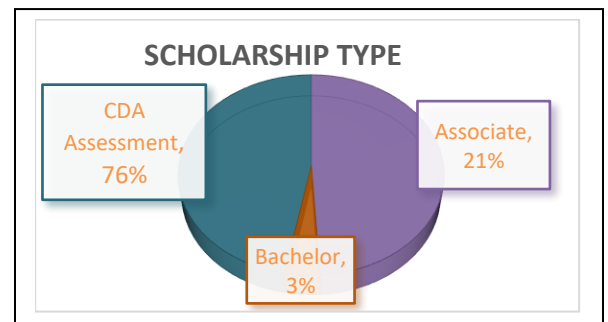
During Fiscal Year 2021 (July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021), T.E.A.C.H. OHIO provided scholarships to 976 early education professionals to increase their education, with 46,284 children benefitting from consistent care provided by better educated teachers. This brings the grand total of scholarship recipients to 12,752 since the program inception in 2003. Some specific outcomes for FY21 include:

PARTICIPATION

- Of 976 total scholarship recipients, they represent the following demographics:
 - 79% (774) began T.E.A.C.H. with only a high school diploma
 - 62% (604) worked with 3-5 year old children
 - 51% (501) worked with children under the age of 3
 - 4% (41) were family child care home providers
 - 32% (315) came from families with no college graduates
 - 41% (396) were people of color
- 627 early care and education programs sponsored staff on scholarships

SCHOLARSHIPS

- 211 Associate degree scholarships (21%) were awarded
- 34 Bachelor degree scholarships (3%) were awarded
- 731 CDA Assessment Fee scholarships (76%) were awarded



EDUCATION

- 2,295 total credit hours were earned by all college credit scholarship recipients
- Associate degree scholars completed an average of 14.61 credit hours per annual contract
- Bachelor degree scholars completed an average of 14.71 credit hours per annual contract
- Associate degree scholars averaged a 3.42 grade point average
- Bachelor degree scholars averaged a 3.62 grade point average

T.E.A.C.H. OHIO GRADUATES

- 32 Associate degree scholarship recipients graduated with their degree
- 2 Bachelor degree scholarship recipients graduated with their degree

COMPENSATION

- The average hourly wage of teachers on T.E.A.C.H. scholarships was \$11.11



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- The average increase in earnings of an Associate degree scholarship recipient was 8.2%
- The average increase in earnings of a Bachelor degree scholarship recipient was 3.3%

RETENTION

- The retention rate for Associate degree scholarship recipients was 76%
- The retention rate for Bachelor degree scholarships was 100%

PARTNERING COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

- 24 community colleges support T.E.A.C.H. scholars
- 3 universities support T.E.A.C.H. scholars

COMPARISON TO NATIONAL RESULTS

Ohio scholars are showing, in many cases, the same or better results than the national averages for the same time period.
