



# 2023 T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® OHIO Annual Report


During Fiscal Year 2023 (July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023), T.E.A.C.H. OHIO provided scholarships to 957 early education professionals to increase their education, with 50,893 children benefitting from consistent care provided by better educated teachers. This brings the grand total of scholarship recipients to 14,566 since the program inception in 2003. Some specific outcomes for FY23 include:

#### **PARTICIPATION**

• Of 957 total scholarship recipients, they represent the following demographics:

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- 84.7% (811) worked with 3-5 year old children
- o 85.5% (818) worked with children under the age of 3
- o 39.8% (381) were people of color
- 25.8% (37) were family child care providers
- 59.6% (572) came from families with no college graduates.
- 542 early care and education programs sponsored staff on scholarships.



### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

- 173 Associate degree scholarships (19.01%) were awarded
- 56 Bachelor degree scholarships (6.15%) were awarded
- 681 CDA Assessment Fee scholarships (74.84%) were awarded

#### **EDUCATION**

- 3,199 total credit hours were earned by all college credit scholarship recipients.
- Associate degree scholars completed an average of 15.37 credit hours per annual contract
- Bachelor degree scholars completed an average of 16.29 credit hours per annual contract
- Associate degree scholars averaged a 3.5 grade point average
- Bachelor degree scholars averaged a 3.7 grade point average

#### T.E.A.C.H. OHIO GRADUATES

- 23 Associate degree scholarship recipients graduated with their degree
- 7 Bachelor degree scholarship recipients graduated with their degree





#### **COMPENSATION**

- The average hourly wage of teachers on T.E.A.C.H. scholarships was \$13.05
- The average increase in earnings of an Associate degree scholarship recipient was 8.7%
- The average increase in earnings of a Bachelor degree scholarship recipient was 11.03%

#### **RETENTION**

- The retention rate for Associate degree scholarship recipients was 99.56%
- The retention rate for Bachelor degree scholarships was 100%

#### **PARTNERING COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES**

- 21 community colleges support T.E.A.C.H. scholars
- 3 universities support T.E.A.C.H. scholars

# **COMPARISON TO NATIONAL RESULTS**

Ohio scholars are showing, in many cases, the same or better results than the national averages for the same time period.
